About the show

In 2024 Ceramic Art London (CAL) celebrates its 20th year and over that time it has become recognised as the most exciting contemporary showcase of current ceramic art, with exhibitors drawn from all over the world. We aim to showcase the best in contemporary studio ceramics, across the full range of styles.

CAL offers makers in ceramics a unique opportunity to exhibit and sell their work in a prestigious central London venue and provides exhibitors with an invaluable opportunity to reach new audiences and to network with established collectors, designers and galleries.

With high visitor numbers, average exhibitor take in 2022 was £6,750 (€7,840 / US\$8,500), with additional offers of exhibitions and commissions resulting from participation in the show.

The main exhibition is accompanied by a full programme of additional activities, including talks, demonstrations and films helping to attract a wide spectrum of collectors, ceramics enthusiasts and to establish new audiences.

Ceramic Art London has completely sold out every year since 2017. In 2024 we move to a larger venue to increase our capacity.

The venue

After five events at Central Saint Martins, we've taken a year off in 2023 to rethink and relaunch in a new larger venue, **Kensington Olympia West**.

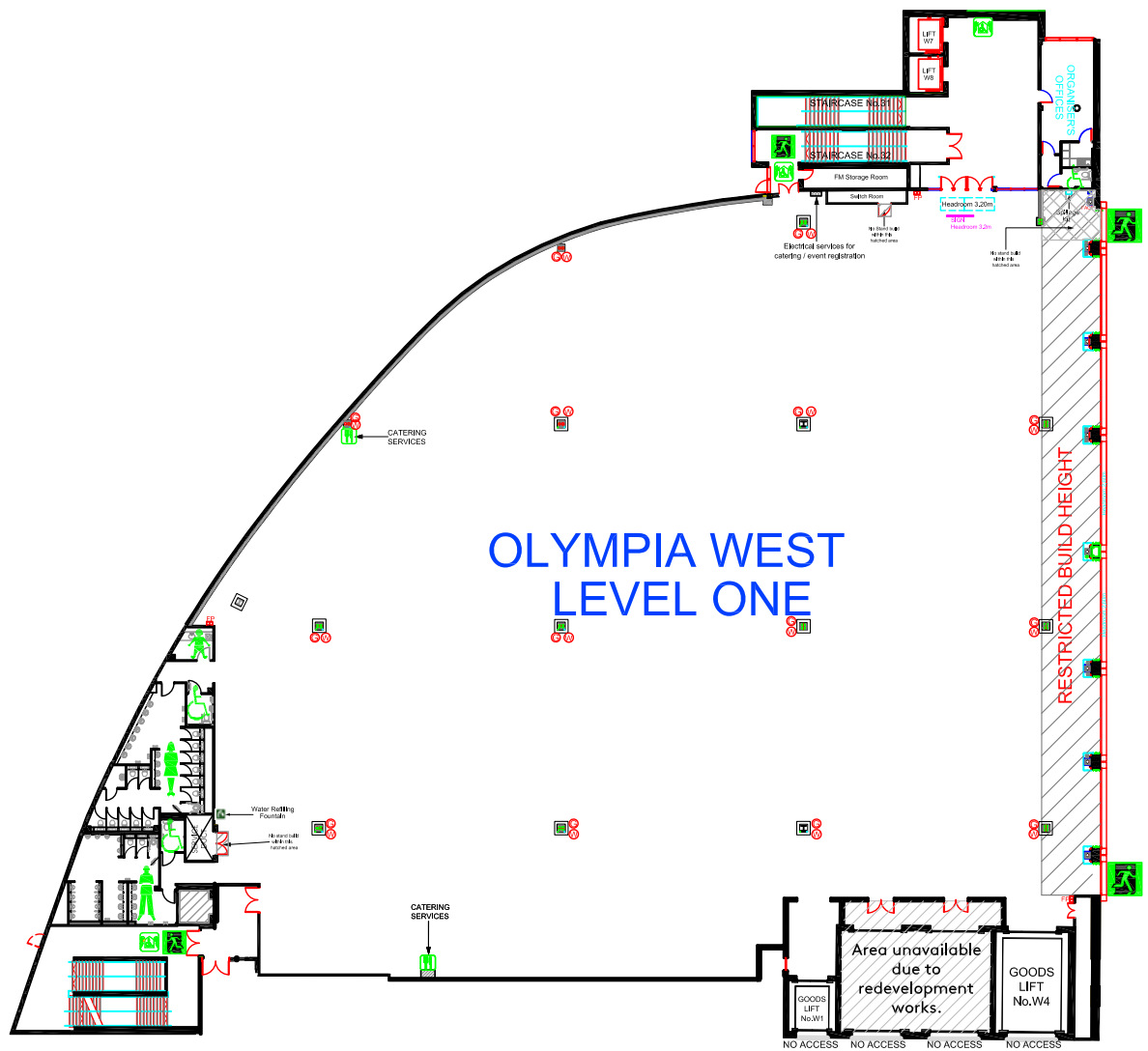
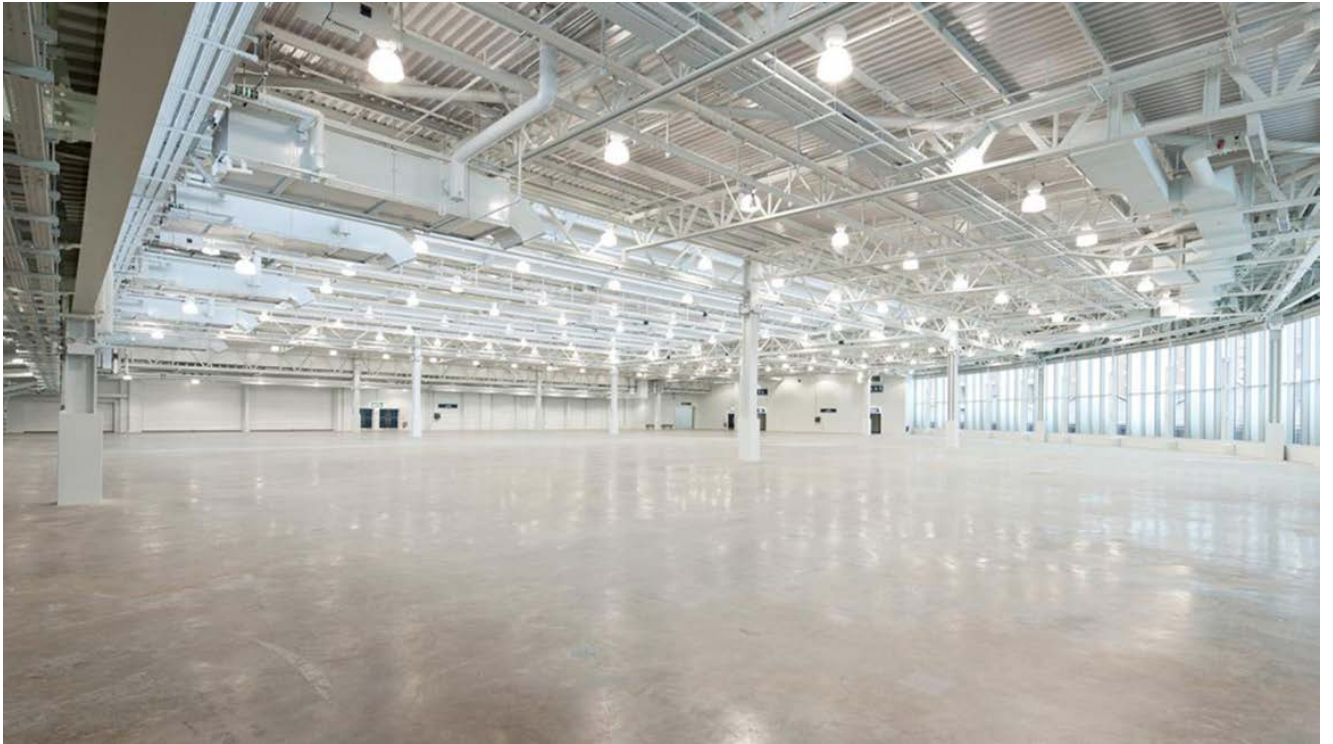
Opened in 1869, Olympia is well-known and loved by Londoners as home to exhibitions, concerts and sporting events.

It is well-connected by tube and rail and close to London's museum quarter in South Kensington, also one of the UK capital's most affluent areas.

Olympia is currently undergoing a major new development which will see the addition of new hotels, restaurants and venues over the next few years.

Olympia West is the newest part of the exhibition complex, with a completely flat multi-purpose layout. It has excellent lighting, including lots of daylight, and a smooth polished concrete floor.

The larger space allows us to enhance our show offer with more activities, food options and a more spacious exhibition layout.



Press and publicity

The event is supported by an integrated press and media campaign including advertising on the London Underground across more than twenty stations, in addition to a major social media campaign.

Previous press coverage includes BBC television and radio news live from the event, The Guardian, The Financial Times, Elle Décor, World of Interiors, Blueprint, Wallpaper and the front page of the London Evening Standard.

A catered Private View will take place in the evening of Thursday 18 April for press, VIPs, trade and valued clients to which exhibitors are issued a number of invitations.

The organiser

The Craft Potters Association is a co-operative of makers that has been representing the best makers in British studio ceramics since 1958, and today is the UK's largest and most diverse ceramics community. We are not-for-profit and owned by our members. We are financially independent and not reliant on any grants or external funding.

Since 1960 we have run [Contemporary Ceramics](#), our central London gallery opposite the British Museum, selling work by our members and mounting monthly exhibitions by top ceramicists.

Every two months we publish [Ceramic Review magazine](#); the leading voice in international ceramics since 1970 with healthy subscriptions and a fast-rising online profile.

We run three major UK ceramic selling fairs, which have seen rapid rises in audiences over the past few years.

Eligibility and Selection

The event is open to all ceramic artists, including those at the start of their careers, and from any country. Ceramic Art London is for individual makers – applications will not be considered from institutions or from agents or wholesalers wanting to sell the work of others.

Exhibitors at Ceramic Art London will be chosen by an independent selection panel. The panel is seeking to curate a dynamic, wide-ranging of original contemporary work of the highest standard is represented. The panel consists of two CPA representatives and three guest selectors. The panel refreshes every year.

We usually receive at least three applications for every place available and the standard is high. Please do come back next year if your application is unsuccessful.

All applicants will be informed of the panel's decisions by email during November 2023. The choice of the selection panel is final and the organisers cannot enter into correspondence regarding the outcome of individual applications.

Commemorative Exhibition Guide

A full colour exhibition guide and catalogue will feature a full page on each Exhibitor with an illustration of their current work, together with a brief statement and full contact details. The cost of the Stand includes a free entry in the Exhibition Guide. A free copy of the Exhibition Guide will be given to all attendees at Ceramic Art London.

Stands

Stands are divided into 6 categories based on display frontage and are priced individually within those bands based on display area

Exhibitors based outside the UK receive a 10% discount

If offered space, exhibitors must confirm their acceptance with an immediate payment of **£250 + £50 VAT** as the first instalment of their Stand fee. This must reach CAL2023 by 15 December 2023 and once paid, this acceptance payment will not be refunded. The balance of Stand fees is due by 31 January 2023. In the event of failure to pay the fees by the due dates, the organisers reserve the right to withdraw the invitation to exhibit and offer the Stand to a selected reserve exhibitor. Stand location within the venue will be entirely at the organiser's discretion.
